Right now, Facing History helps millions of youth every year make the essential connection between history and the moral choices they confront in their own lives. At a time when we are all challenged by painful events across the globe, adolescents are actively wrestling with who they are and what they believe, and are hungry for meaningful and effective ways to understand and respond to the world's conflicts. Facing History allows them to grapple with issues of race, antisemitism, inter-group hatred, and social justice in the face of a changing and challenging world.

We are especially pleased to thank Roger Brooks and the Facing History staff for an outstanding transition to new leadership for the organization. As our President and CEO since December 2014, Roger has taken bold steps to imagine Facing History's future, including a deep exploration of the future of digital learning.

We also want to extend our heartfelt gratitude to Tracy Palandjian for her service as chair, and then co-chair, of the Board of Directors from November 2011 to November 2014. We are delighted that Tracy will continue to bring her guidance and wisdom to Facing History in her role as a member of the Board of Directors.

We want to thank each and every one of our supporters and advocates for being part of an extraordinary year in the life of Facing History and look forward to keeping in touch.

Why Facing History and Ourselves?

Acts of hatred are battering communities as close as our own backyard and as far as a world away. Every day, we see how fragile democracy can be through reports of religious, ethnic, and racial violence. And it's getting worse.

This is why the work of Facing History and Ourselves is so critically important.

Facing History helps students learn about hatred and bigotry so they can stop them in the future.

From the failure of democracy in Germany and the events leading to the Holocaust, to struggles for civil rights from the United States to South Africa, Facing History trusts students to wrestle with complex moments in human history and contemporary events the world over, helping them become engaged and compassionate citizens in the process.

Facing History combines historical analysis with the study of human behavior to heighten students' understanding of racism, antisemitism, and prejudice; increase their ability to relate history to their own lives; and promote greater understanding of their roles and responsibilities in a democracy.

Schools have the capacity to both teach about and model civil society by promoting compassion, justice, respect, and understanding.

Effective teachers play a critical role in increasing students' achievement, engagement, respect, resilience, and empathy.

Yet schools aren't currently up to the task. We face a crisis in education due in large part to an insufficient number of effective teachers in classrooms. When teachers feel ineffective and lack support to tackle difficult topics with diverse groups of students, they become disempowered. When young people feel excluded from the experience of learning, they become disengaged. This leaves both teachers and students with the belief that they can't make a difference, nor should they even try.

Facing History supports teachers, transforms schools, and motivates students to think differently.

Facing History classroom resources, professional development, and coaching invigorates teachers and equips them with the tools they need to help students thrive in a diverse 21st century world.

In a randomized controlled trial it has been proved that in schools where Facing History was being taught, students reported getting along better with other students and experienced greater respect between teachers and students across the school.

Facing History transforms entire schools into communities of respect, empathy, and academic engagement that take seriously issues of ethics, social responsibility, prejudice, and justice.

A Passion for Education

Susie Richardson, member of the Board of Directors and past Chair of the San Francisco Bay Area Advisory Board, began her involvement with Facing History in 2001. A passionate advocate for education, Susie understands the value of investing in educators and the impact that each teacher can have over the course of his or her career. Susie and her family made a generous gift and proudly dedicated Facing History's *Teaching Mockingbird* study guide to their father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, the late Judge Howard M. Holtzmann, as an expression of the values their family holds dear.

Thanks to their generous support, Facing History now provides English/Language Arts teachers with tools for teaching *To Kill a Mockingbird*, the most widely taught novel in American secondary schools. In its first year, *Teaching Mockingbird* has reached more than 3,700 educators and education leaders around the country, with nearly 650 teachers attending our professional development sessions on the resource. Susie and her family are honored to support the work of Facing History because they truly believe the organization can change the world.

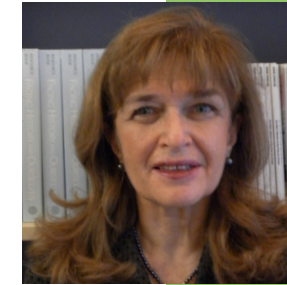

Growing Our International Work

The Edmond J. Safra Philanthropic Foundation has supported Facing History's international program since 2007. Founded by Edmond J. Safra, a prominent banker and philanthropist who passed away in 1999, the foundation is now led by his wife Lily. Under her leadership, the foundation has assisted hundreds of organizations in over 40 countries, providing vital support in the areas of education, science and medicine, and religion; and humanitarian assistance, culture, and social welfare.

The foundation's initial funding provided support for Facing History's international seminar from 2007–2012 and helped establish the organization's London office. The most recent grant of \$300,000 supports a pilot project to combat the troubling rise of inter-group hatred and violence in France. Dr. Karen Murphy, Facing History's international director, is leading the project, working to establish partnerships across the education sector and civil society organizations. Through these partnerships, Facing History plans to help teachers and their students address important topics such as colonization, independence and immigration, antisemitism and anti-Muslim prejudice, and guide discussion of the Holocaust and France's complex history. The organization will create new resources and translate existing ones that will allow us to expand our reach around the world.

Facing History in Canada

Sharon Weintraub began her involvement with Facing History in 1981. She was one of the first educators to connect with Facing History, and helped to introduce educators in Toronto to the organization. From the beginning, Sharon envisioned establishing a Facing History "north" office in Canada. Her vision was realized in 2008 when she generously contributed the foundational gift that opened the office in Toronto, Ontario. Sharon has served as an integral member of the Ontario Advisory Board, and has advanced the growth of the office in major ways.

This year, Sharon spearheaded efforts to organize the office's inaugural fundraising event, which honored advisory board member Nate Leipziger. She also made a generous gift in support of the Building Bridges project. Funded in part by Citizenship and Immigration Canada, this project extends Facing History's reach to northern Ontario and Manitoba for the first time. Through her commitment to Facing History, Sharon has played a significant role in bringing its resources and learning strategies to over 2,100 educators across Canada.

General Counsel: Pro Bono Partnership

Brown Rudnick LLP is General Counsel to Facing History and Ourselves, having served in that capacity on a pro bono basis since the organization's incorporation in 1982. The firm advises Facing History on virtually all legal matters including protecting its resource collections and intellectual property, negotiating office leases and agreements in the U.S., Canada, and the U.K., reviewing partnership contracts and funding agreements, corporate governance, litigation, and guiding the organization through complex tax codes and non-profit regulations. Facing History is grateful to retired Brown Rudnick partner and member of the Facing History and Ourselves Board of Directors Lawrence (Larry) Levy and his colleagues who provide particular expertise to our organization: Tom Phillips (primary liaison to Facing History)—real estate advice and general counseling; Michael Cohen—corporate governance and contracts; Barbara Kelly—tax law; and Edward Naughton—intellectual property and litigation. Additional thanks to Al Wallis, Executive Director of the Brown Rudnick Center for the Public Interest, and the Brown Rudnick Charitable Foundation. In addition to Brown Rudnick's contribution of thousands of hours (representing millions of dollars) of pro bono legal services over the years, Facing History has received more than \$100,000 in the form of programmatic support from the firm's foundation since 2004.

Leadership for Raising Ethical Children

In their second year as co-chairs of the Raising Ethical Children program, New England Advisory Board members **Wendy Fischman** and **Julie Swartz** have been actively working to bring relevant Facing History programs to families with young children. They believe, as parents and members of the Facing History community, that the concepts raised in a Facing History classroom are relevant to children of all ages. Specifically, this program is designed to stimulate thinking about how issues of identity, inclusion, and exclusion, respect for differences, participation, and other key Facing History concepts relate to the children in one's life and their experiences outside of school.

This year Wendy and Julie facilitated, with Facing History program staff, a new series using literature as a tool to explore themes focused on moral and ethical development, the power of stereotyping and prejudice, the role of upstanders in responding to injustice, and the impact of the legacies of injustice on individuals, groups, communities, and the world at large. This program drew more than 100 participants throughout the year, and Wendy and Julie are working to grow the program's reach even further.

FY 2015 Gift Report

A Message From Lisa Mooney

Chair of the Development Committee

Giving to Facing History remained strong in fiscal year 2015, with cash receipts totaling \$24.17 million from a record 4,200 donors. As we enter the fourth year of a five-year growth plan that will enable us to double our impact on educators and students worldwide, we do so with more than \$84 million of the \$112 million development target secured as of June 30, 2015.

This year, we expanded our network of implementing teachers to more than 41,000 educators, who reached 4.1 million students in classrooms around the globe. We are deeply grateful to the individuals, corporations, and foundations who fund the majority of our operating budget each year, and we recognize their generosity in the following pages.

Sustaining Gift Program

For more than three decades, Facing History has engaged students in the study of history and ethical decision making in order to teach civic responsibility, tolerance, courage, and compassion. With increasing demand from schools and teachers, and impact data that demonstrates the continued effectiveness of our work, Facing History depends on the increased investment of annual support from leadership donors to reach more students each year.

Multiyear commitments and annual gifts of \$100,000 or more are recognized in the Sustaining Gift Program, which has grown to include 94 families, foundations, and corporations. FY 2015 Treasurer's Report

A Message From Elizabeth Jick Treasurer and Chair of the Finance Committee

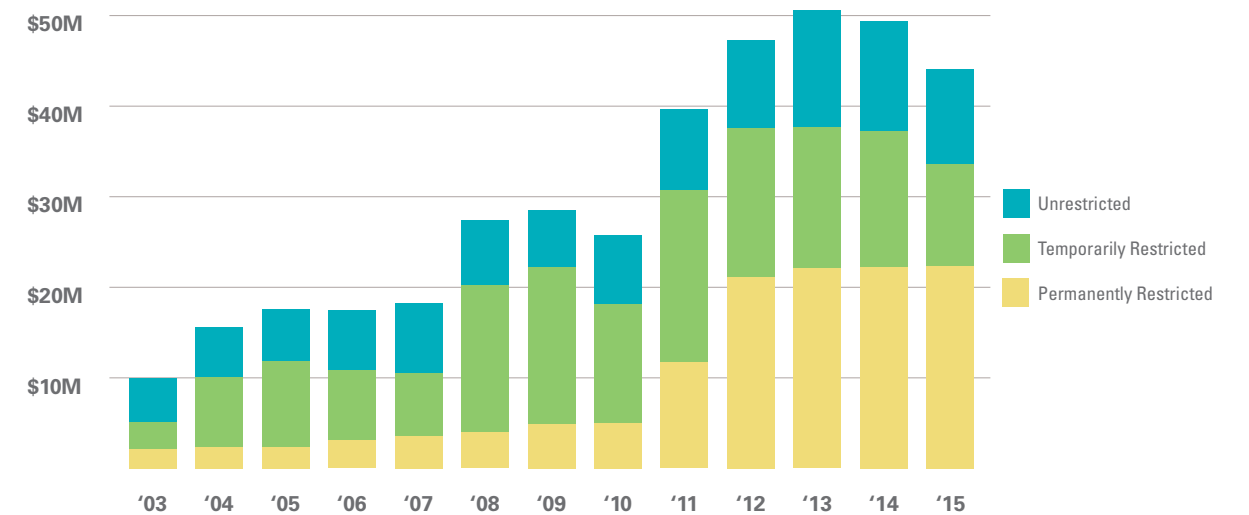
Fiscal year 2015 was a period of transition for Facing History and Ourselves. During the year, we successfully completed our search for a new leader, hiring Roger Brooks as President and Chief Executive Officer. We also brought on a new Chief Financial Officer, David Orlinoff, and commenced the search process for a new Chief Development Officer.

Facing History's financial condition continues to be strong. We ended the year with more than \$44 million in net assets and \$31.5 million in cash and investments. Our annual budget increased by almost \$1 million to \$25.2 million, allowing us to further invest in expanding our impact and excellence. Due to the continued generosity of our multi-year donors and loyal supporters, we were able to enter FY 2015 with over 40% of our projected expenses covered. Our development department exceeded its global fundraising target, raising \$23.7 million. Net assets declined by approximately \$5.2 million from the FY 2014 level, primarily due to the planned spending down of receipts on restricted gifts and grants carried over from prior years. Total operating expenses increased by almost \$1.7 million from FY 2014, which covered transition-related expenses and both new and expanded initiatives in content, program delivery, and public engagement.

Facing History's financial leadership team, including the Finance Committee and internal staff, are bringing increased attention to issues of accountability, financial reporting, and effective use of resources. We are committed to enhancing our budget process and financial accounting to increase fiscal and programmatic security and accountability throughout our global organization.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and Board of Trustees, I want to thank the members of the Finance, Audit, and Investment Committees and Facing History's management and staff for all their extraordinary work. I also thank them for their unwavering support and continued commitment to the organization's long-term financial sustainability and success.
